DATA SYSTEM TRANSITION – THINGS TO KNOW

Our transition to the Arbor data management system continues this term with the **bookings and payments** system activated.

This has now replaced ParentPay. No more charges will be applied there and outstanding balances from that system will be transferred into Arbor in March.

All parents - mums **and** dads - have accounts within the Arbor system – if you are experiencing difficulty in logging in please contact the office.

Payments now made within Arbor include:

- **Trips and visits** all of the processes associated with these can now be managed within Arbor, including parental consent and charges of any associated payments.
- Wraparound Care parents should now pre-book breakfast and after-school club sessions within the Arbor system. This will only allow a booking if credit is available on the account but charges are only applied after an attendance mark is given by the office. The office will also make any necessary adjustments on the basis of the club registers. If you want to use tax-free childcare vouchers to pay for wraparound care, please contact the office who will adjust settings to reflect this and advise on how to add voucher credits.
- Nursery Charges charges for attendance outside funded hours will be applied in Arbor weekly on the basis of attendance as they were in ParentPay and a half-termly invoice sent home to summarise the charges applied.
- **Parent Pay Balances** all outstanding balances will be added to Arbor by the office as part of the process of shutting down ParentPay. It would help if these were mostly cleared in that system before 4 March. If accounts have credit in ParentPay, this will be applied against outstanding debts before the balance is transferred.

NOTE: ordering and payments for **school meals** remain within Dolce's bespoke **SchoolGrid** system. Parents should ensure there is credit on this account to pay for meals ordered. Where credit is not available, the cost will be recharged to your Arbor account and we may apply an additional processing charge of £3 per meal.

UNIFORM REMINDER

When we set the uniform policy (in 2019) we aimed to make it easy to source items from multiple suppliers by choosing commonly available plain colours for uniform items; predominantly plain bottle green & plain black.

Recently a creeping increase in stripes, manufacturer logos and other things that make black items 'not plain black' have been noted by staff.

Please remind children that plain black means items should be ... just **black**.

Black uniform items this includes are:

- Trousers and skirts
- Shorts
- Leggings & Joggers
- Hoodies & Fleeces
- Shoes

If you are struggling to source plain black items, the PTFFE uniform shop may have stock available, and places like ASDA are generally quite reliable sources.

E-SAFETY – HOME FILTERING

All our pupil chromebooks are now covered by a monitoring system called Senso which will alert staff to usage that is a cause for concern or breaches acceptable use policies, whether at school or at home. This includes attempts to access inappropriate material.

Senso itself does not directly filter/block online material, since this is managed whilst devices are **at school** by the school network. It is important that parents are aware that this could mean that children are able to access inappropriate content whilst using their chromebooks on **home** internet connections – either deliberately or accidentally.


Parents are reminded that our appropriate use policy and agreement specifies that pupils should be supervised when using school devices at home – ideally by being in the same room as an adult who can see their screen.

Parents are also encouraged to explore or review the filtering options available to limit what can be accessed on home networks. These settings will apply to any device being used to access the internet, including tablets, phones and consoles.

All internet providers publish guidance to parents on how to secure their home networks, but a generic guide and a link to a useful <u>network filtering test</u> tool can be found on our website:
