CHANGES TO STAGGERED SCHOOL DAYS

Since the start of this school year, we have had a staggered school day, in line with general guidance on limiting the spread of Covid-19. Early Years and KS1 finish at 15:15, with KS2 leaving at 15:25.

In light of the ongoing removal of covid restrictions and guidance, there is now less of a need for staggered ends to the school day. Whilst there remain some traffic calming benefits, the ten-minute gap is slightly longer than it needs to be for this purpose alone.

After Easter, we will *either* return to Reception, KS1 and KS2 ending at the same time, *or* keep a slight offset between infants and juniors to assist with parking management.

From *next week* (Monday 28th March), we will bring the Reception/KS1 and KS2 end times closer together again, initially aiming to maintain the traffic benefits. This will involve infant end times being moved back five minutes to 15:20, whilst juniors will remain at 15:25.

Families who have Reception/KS1 and KS2 pupils should collect all of their children at the later time of 15:25. They will be released from the EYFS yard together.

I would appreciate feedback from parents who collect by car during next week, to determine what your experiences of parking and departing are.

If there seems to be no real traffic benefit to that five minute offset, we will simply move both Key Stages back to a traditional 15:25 finish after Easter; if it seems sensible to keep a five-minute buffer we will stick with that.

NURSERY PUPILS

Standard nursery sessions run to 15:00 and we recognise this can create a slightly awkward collection time offset for some families who have older siblings to collect too.

Nursery families who have older siblings to collect too are welcome to **either** collect their nursery child at 15:00 and return for the older siblings, **or** to simply collect **all** siblings between 15:20-15:30. This will involve adding an additional 30 minutes onto the nursery day which can be funded either through FEF hours or, if these are already fully allocated to nursery sessions during the week, charged as additional time at £2 per day.
