FOCUS ON PHONICS

Systematic synthetic phonics now underpins the teaching of reading in all primary schools, but can be a bit of a mystery to the majority of adults.

A number of parents have expressed an interest in finding out more, so Janette will revisit phonics for the adult learning theme next half-term.

This is an opportunity to learn about the principles of phonics, and how the monster phonics scheme supports learning to read at Fir Ends.



Parents of pupils in years R-2 will also see a subtle change to the way that Monster Phonics decodable books are deployed after the break which will bring this in line with the scheme design and enhance the way the monsters support our early readers.
