## Do YOU know a possible partnership governor?

Governing bodies include a range of governor categories: **parent governors** are drawn from and elected by the parent community; **co-opted governors** are selected by the other governors; **LA governors** are selected from employees of the Local Authority; and a **staff governor** is elected by the staff.

As a **Foundation School**, our governing body also has to have a statutory minimum of two partnership governor roles. These **cannot** be parents of current pupils, but should be drawn from the wider community and, ideally, nominated **by** parents.

Although filling parent, staff and co-opted roles is usually quite simple, we have been seeking two partnership governors since September, without success.

We also have a vacancy for the LA governor role.

If you know of anyone suitable, for example a retiree or local business person, who would like to know more, please ask them to contact the head or chair of governors.

## SPARE PLACES IN NURSERY AND RECEPTION...

We are anticipating lower than usual intakes in nursery and Reception classes over the next year or two with relatively few toddlers locally. Naturally, we'd prefer fuller classrooms.

If your child is starting primary or secondary school this September, Cumberland County Council provide free school transport for pupils who live more than two miles away (up to eight years old) or three miles away (aged eight years old and over).

## Monster Phonics

Those of you with pupils in Early Years and KS1 should now be quite familiar with the decodable reading books and the family of monsters that support our phonics curriculum.

Our collection of paper books has proven increasingly difficult to distribute as we'd like - and prone to damage from puddles, yoghurt, water bottles, being sat on, toddlers, dogs, bananas....

### MEASLES WARNING

Parents are being asked to make sure children are fully up to date with their MMR vaccinations after cases of Measles were confirmed in the Northwest. Parents can check their child's vaccine records by looking in their "Red Book" or asking their GP. Measles is a highly infectious disease that can lead to serious problems such as pneumonia, meningitis, and on rare occasions, long-term disability, or death. Symptoms include a high fever, sore red watery eyes, and a blotchy red brown rash, and it is particularly easy to catch/spread in environments when in close contact with others.
